TO: All SNAP State Agencies
All Regions

To assist with preparing FY 2022 State SNAP-Ed plans by the regulatory deadline of August 15, 2021, FNS is projecting your expected FY 2022 allocations for planning purposes only. Based on estimates provided by the Office of Management and Budget for the development of the President's FY 2022 Budget, FNS is projecting the FY 2022 national SNAP-Ed allocation at \$442,960,000. The projected allocation for each State is attached.

Final SNAP-Ed allocations may change as a result of changes in SNAP participation or the June 2021 Consumer Price Index (CPI-U), per the statutory funding formula defined in Section 28(d)(1)(F) of the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008. June CPI-U data will not be available until late summer. SNAP-Ed allocations are subject to the availability of Federal funds. FY 2022 and prior year allocations are available on the SNAP-Ed Connection website at: <https://snaped.fns.usda.gov/> under the Program Administration tab.
