Subject: Fiscal Year (FY) 2026 Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Education (SNAP-Ed) Estimated Allocations

To: All SNAP State Agencies  
All Regions

This memo shares the estimated Fiscal Year (FY) 2026 allocations to assist State agencies in preparing their Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Education (SNAP-Ed) plans by the regulatory deadline of August 15, 2025. These FY 2026 allocations are for planning purposes only since actual amounts will differ as additional data is collected. Based on current estimates, the Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) projects the FY 2026 national SNAP-Ed allocation at \$550,000,000. The estimated allocation for each SNAP State agency is enclosed.

FNS expects to release the final SNAP-Ed allocations in summer 2025 to reflect any changes in SNAP participation and the June 2025 Consumer Price Index for all Urban Consumers (CPI-U), per the statutory funding formula defined in Section 28(d)(1)(F) of the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008. SNAP-Ed allocations are subject to the availability of Federal funds.
