Subject: Fiscal Year (FY) 2025 Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Nutrition Education (SNAP-Ed) Final Allocations

To: All SNAP State Agencies

The Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) is pleased to announce the release of the FY 2025 final SNAP-Ed allocations totaling \$536,000,000. The SNAP-Ed allocation is 100 percent Federally funded and is calculated annually based on a ratio of a State's share of historical national SNAP-Ed expenditure in FY 2009, and a State's current SNAP participation as compared to national SNAP participation. These allocations are subject to the availability of Federal funds.
